



BY-LAWS: General/Miscellaneous

- 1.00:** In the event of a Team having to forfeit (taking no further part in the remaining games) during a Championship Event, all prior points gained will be deducted and a bye will take the place of that Team, for all games. (1985)
- 2.00:** That all reports for the Australian Championships to be tabled at the AGM meeting following the Championships. (1987)
- 3.00:** All Notices of Motion to be circulated to all Affiliates a minimum of 35 days (five (5) weeks) prior to the Council AGM. Any Affiliate unable to attend the AGM, may by written authority appoint a proxy to vote on their behalf at the AGM. All votes to be counted at that meeting and the results recorded in the minutes and circulated to all Affiliates. (1989)
- 4.00:** Each Affiliated Men's Association may only enter a maximum of Three (3) Teams in the Men's State Team Championships. Each Team to have a minimum of six (6) players per Team. Plus (where possible) a bookkeeper. (29/4/2001)
- 5.00:** Each Affiliated Ladies Association may only enter a maximum of Two (2) Teams in the Ladies State Team Championships. Each Team to have a minimum of six (6) players per Team. Plus (where possible) a bookkeeper. (29/4/2001)
- 6.00:** The Board of Management of the Council reserves the right to include additional Teams to alleviate byes where necessary. The Games Coordinator of the *Council* shall give first option to the largest Affiliated Association to fill byes where necessary, should they refuse the option it shall be offered to other Affiliated Associations in order of membership. (21st February 1998)
- 7.00:** Mixed gender Affiliated Associations "Registered as such" shall have their State Team entries treated as in rules 4 and 5 above.
- 8.00:** A player may represent one Association only, either Metropolitan or Country in the one year. Unless Player has Inter-Association transfer through employment or change of locality address. (23rd November 1997)
- 9.00:** In all Council Team Events requiring a Team average, the average will be correlated, incorporating the average of the total number of **players** nominated in that Team. At no time will that number be greater than eight (8) **players**. (1st April 2001)

- 10.00:** Any player registered with the Council may play in for more than one Affiliated Association, provided he/she obtains a Permit from the Association first registered with, such Player will only represent the Association first registered with, in Council run Competitions. Such player must abide by individual Associations own Constitution.
- 10.00.1: While players are permitted to play for more than one Association, they must obtain a signed Permit Form from their **First (Parent) Association** and present it to any other Association they play for. It shall be the player/s responsibility to obtain a correctly completed and signed Permit Form. The player should take the **Pink** copy (second copy) to the second Association. The original (**white** copy) must be forwarded to the Council Registrar by the First Association, within seven (7) days of granting the permit.
The first Association should keep the **yellow** (third copy) for their own records.
- 10.00.2: Permits must be issued each year. Separate permits must be issued for each Association that the player wishes to play with.
- 11.00:** Any Association dealing with a permit player can only suspend that player from that Associations competition. The Association should then advise the players "Parent" (number one) Association and the Council the reason of any suspension and or penalty imposed. (17th February 2002).
- 12.00:** Inter-Association Transfers and Darts Federation of Australia Transfers:
- 12.00.1: Any player wishing to transfer to a new Association must correctly complete a Transfer Form, obtained from the new Association Secretary.
The Secretary of the new Association must immediately forward the first and second copies (white and pink) to the Council Registrar. The third (yellow) copy should stay in the book for that Associations records.
- 12.00.2: The Council Registrar will record the date received and date of application and then immediately forward them to the original Association Secretary.
- 12.00.3: The original Association should make sure the player is eligible for transfer and deal with the transfer within twenty-eight (28) days. The pink copy is then retained by the original Association for their records and the white copy must be forwarded to the Council Registrar who, will in turn, immediately notify the new Association if the transfer has been granted or refused.
- 12.00.4: Failure to deal with the transfer within twenty-eight (28) days of postage by the Council Registrar will result in an automatic transfer.
- 12.00.5: Failure of a Player to comply with section 12.00.1 will automatically null and void an application for transfer and a new application will have to be submitted.
- 12.00.6: Inter-Assoc Transfers are available at any time.
- 13.00:** In Under 25s Teams Championships events, a Player who is not required to represent his/her first Association, may play for another Association, without the need of an Inter-Association Transfer. Provided that he/she has contacted his/her first Association Secretary and confirmed that he/she is not required by their first Association and has their permission to represent another Association in the Championships.



BY-LAWS: General/Miscellaneous

- 14.00:** **Council Medal: Highest Seasonal Progressive Average Male/Female.**
- 14.01: Eligibility for players to qualify for the “Council Medal” shall be confined to those players competing in Affiliated Association/s with a playing format consisting of, team/trebles, doubles and singles, as the standard playing format.
- 14.02: Averages for players playing in “handicapped singles format games only” or “handicapped doubles and singles games only” shall not be considered.
- 14.03: The player achieving the highest eligible seasonal average in whichever Affiliated Association/s he/she is registered in shall be declared the winner/s.
- 14.04: Association Secretary/s should be aware of “Bye Laws: Affiliation” Rule 5.00.1 to ensure that their players averages are forwarded on time for considerations.
- 15.00:** **Player/s averages** for all Team Championship Events conducted by the Council shall be that player/s First (Parent) Associations progressive seasonal average from the previous year.
- 15.01: In the case of a player not having a previous seasonal average, the player’s current progressive average shall be submitted.
- 15.02: In all **OPEN** and **“B” GRADE** Events conducted by the Council the player/s highest previous seasonal average in whichever affiliated Association that average was achieved shall be used for grading.
- 15.03: It shall be a player/s responsibility to ensure he/she has a current **Seasonal Average Card** with them when registering for darts events. Those player/s unable to prove their average shall play in open events only not “B” events.
